At 14-years of age, Bresha ran away and told relatives she feared for her life, "because her father was beating her mother and threatening to kill the whole family." Two months later, Bresha was incarcerated on July 28th in a juvenile detention facing a life sentence for aggravated murder charges for killing her abusive father.

Please endorse the call to Free Bresha Meadows from juvenile detention, have all charges against her dropped, and support her safety and well-being as she is reunited with her family. o endorse the call to action.
