Background on StoryCenter

- Developed original [digital storytelling methodology](#) in 1993
- Lengthy history of collaborative work with [community-based and institutional partners](#) around the world
- Accessible to individuals at all levels of experience as storytellers and video editors (we are skilled at adapting our methods for non-literate or low-literacy groups)



Rationale for Using Personal Storytelling to Address Domestic Violence

Research shows that telling and listening to stories can ...

- increase [self-esteem](#) and [wellbeing](#)
- function as [information / skill-building](#) tools
- [help communities bond and become politicized](#)
- [inspire people to take action for change](#)
- influence [public policy](#) and [legislative decision-making](#)



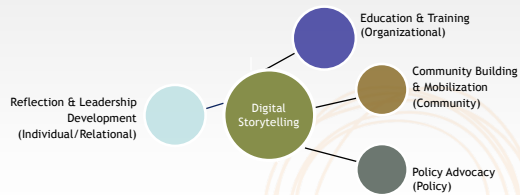
