The value of your story

- Stories inspire change and growth
- Benefits both storyteller and listener

Stories of adult children exposed to domestic violence can:







Paint a picture about the complex and multifaceted experience of living with a batterer

Reflect on key opportunities for intervention and support

Share a path to resilience, noting the assets and strengths gained along the way

Making the case to yourself

- Realizing the value of your story is a journey
- Complicated by experiences of trauma and oppression
- Impacted by upbringing and cultural values

Considerations when valuing your worth

- Importance of centering survivors experiences
- Personal expertise and experience
- Risks and consequences of sharing trauma stories, especially for people of color

Making the case to our agencies/systems

- Responsibility for centering survivors experiences
- What it means to be "out" in professional settings
- Requires a shift to embrace an asset-based framework

Negotiating terms and fees

- Speaker rates in different settings
- Contracts vs. stipends
- Reasonable expectations of hosts: travel costs & arrangements, accommodations, accessibility, safety & well-being



- Retaining rights to your story
- Considerations regarding family members and others named in your story



- Creating and maintaining boundaries
- Managing trolls
- Prioritizing your wellness
