The Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence (ICADV), in collaboration with member programs from across the state, has engaged in a multi-year process to re-center Indiana's prevention strategies and program services in survivor-defined needs. With this effort, the Coalition sought to identify the programs and services that were most valued by survivors, what needs were unmet, and fundamentally, how communities could reduce violence by increasing safety and supports for all of us.
