#### **Our Mission:**

To transform the lives of individuals and their families experiencing domestic violence by working to decrease gender inequity and intimate partner violence in Central New Mexico's Latinx and immigrant communities



Enlace is a social justice organization led by Latinx immigrants in Central New Mexico, founded (in 2000) in response to a lack of culturally specific services for the Latinx and immigrant communities.

#### We provide:

- o Culturally and linguistically specific, trauma-informed direct services (in Spanish);
- Prevention-focused community education, outreach, and policy advocacy in collaboration with community partners; and
- Intergenerational, survivor-focused leadership development (Promotoras and Youth Leaders).

Our services are survivor-centered and client-directed to address both household and community pressures, as well as systemic socioeconomic and racial inequities.



#### **Prevention Department**

EC's prevention services operate at community and household levels through leadership development training and educational outreach to promote equitable, gender-affirming practices among parents, youth, and their extended community.

#### **Prevention Department – Youth Leaders**

The Youth Leaders are witnesses or survivors of DV who have previously received EC services. The Youth Leaders Program is designed for youth between 13 - 17 years of age and is ideal for teens who are interested in building their leadership and presentation skills.

Youth Leaders make a positive impact in their communities by reducing violence and fostering healthy, gender-inclusive relationships. Through the program, youth become self-empowered teen leaders through leadership development and teamwork.



Youth Leaders receive a total of 55 hours of training throughout their 1-year commitment (September – August)

#### Training topics include:

- Healthy relating/healthy breakups
- Teen Dating Violence 101
- Leadership
- Presentation and Facilitation Skills
- Consent
- Human Trafficking
- · Teen Mental Health First Aid
- Financial Capability



#### **Program Consists of:**

- 4 consecutive Saturdays of training (9am-4pm)
- 1 training/month there after (paid training)
- Bi-weekly meetings (planning, scheduling, review of evals from presentations)
- Present in at least 4 sites (schools, events, community centers, etc.)
- Participate in at lest 4 community events (Information Tables)
- Maintain enrollment in school
- Incentives are given to youth (\$25-\$40/presentation or information table)



Through relational-tivity, we embody courageous spaces that center Indigenous women and girls to connect with ancestral knowingness, healing strengths, and lifeways for the wellbeing of all.

Tewa Women United (TWU) started in 1989 as a support group for women from the Pueblos of the northern Rio Grande concerned with the traumatic effects of colonization, religious inquisition, and militarization leading to issues such as alcoholism, suicide, domestic/sexual violence and environmental violence
